Annual NAHTRG Meeting

NAHTRG held its annual meeting on 4 March 2025. The meeting aimed to bring together members to discuss national priorities for animal health training and development. Here's what each jurisdiction has been working on and their current priorities.

AHA

AHA delivered key workshops, including LLI, NMG and NBRT training. Moving forward, they will focus on delivering LLI in QLD and SA, CCEAD training, and deeper member engagement in emergency preparedness.

NSW

NSW launched a new LMS ('Bridge'), advanced HPAI training, and is prioritizing a Learning Library and expanded field operations training via a train-the-trainer model.

TAS

Tasmania began building an emergency response capability framework with a focus on addressing field staff training gaps and enhancing compliance training.

QLD

Queensland progressed EAD preparedness through ASF initiatives and biosecurity exercises, with future efforts focused on targeted training and sustainable capability development.

VIC

Victoria completed Authorised Officer training, transitioned to a new LMS transition and is now focusing on proactive planning and staff development amid ongoing resourcing challenges.

NT

Northern Territory updated emergency plans and expanded AIIMS and biosecurity training. 2025 priorities include workforce sharing frameworks and a biosecurity exercise in Katherine.

ACT

The ACT led a successful HPAI response and EAD exercise and is now working to implement lessons learned and strengthen interagency training and collaboration.

AHA

Topics covered included leadership development, team management, incident and emergency response, communications, cross-sector awareness, and stakeholder and industry engagement.
