

# HOW TO ENROL IN THE EAD FOUNDATION ONLINE COURSE

## About the EAD FOUNDATION ONLINE COURSE

The EAD Foundation Online course is designed as a generic introduction for Emergency Animal Disease (EAD) training.

The course is the first element in the national approach to provide education and training for government officers, livestock producers, veterinary practitioners and other personnel in Australian livestock industries who may be involved in an EAD response.

There are two parts to the course; Part 1 which covers EAD awareness and arrangements, and Part 2 which is specific to working in a response. Depending on your purpose for doing this course, you may choose to complete Part 1 of the course, Part 2 of the course, or both.

### Access the EAD Foundation Online course

To register as a learner (you only need to do this once)

- 1 Access AHA's Learning System at <http://aha.canopihr.com.au> (we recommend using Google Chrome)
- 2 Click on 'Register' in the Log-in panel, and fill in your personal details
- 3 Click on 'Sign Up' at the bottom
- 4 You will be sent an email to set your password
- 5 Follow the link and type your preferred password
- 6 You will be taken to the Learning homepage
- 7 Click on 'Browse Learning' to enrol in a course
- 8 Click on your name to edit your personal profile.

### To enrol in the EAD Foundation Online course

- 1 Log in at <http://aha.canopihr.com.au>
- 2 Click on 'Browse learning' and select *EAD Foundation Course*
- 3 There are 3-4 modules in the two parts of the course, plus a final assessment at the end of each part. The whole course should take you about 3-4 hours to complete
- 4 You do not need to complete the course in one sitting. Your progress will be automatically saved
- 5 You must visit all pages of both part 1 and part 2 of the course and achieve 80% on the final assessments to pass the course
- 6 Upon successful completion, you will be able to print a Certificate of Completion.
