Biosecurity is the management of risks to the economy, the environment and the community created by invasive species and diseases entering, emerging, establishing or spreading.

Biosecurity is a shared responsibility between governments, industry organisations, the community and individual land owners. It is important that everyone plays their part because no one person can do it on their own!

Our vision is to see market access and productivity protected and improved through a unified, accountable and progressive biosecurity system.

The strategy will provide producers with knowledge vital to the improvement of on farm biosecurity measures.

Continually enhancing and improving biosecurity practices maintains the strong biosecurity reputation of Australia's sheep flock and improves on-farm productivity, which leads to a more resilient and competitive industry.

The NSIBS was developed by Sheep Producers Australia and WoolProducers Australia and funded by Animal Health Australia.

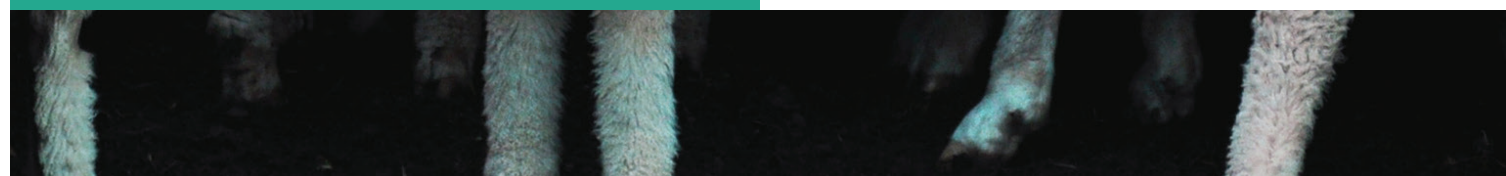
Sheep Producers Australia is the peak industry organisation for sheep and lamb producers.
